She made it possible for me to attend a seminar at the Betty Ford Clinic for family members and found NA meetings for me to attend so that I could better understand my own role in my son's addictions and how to help him through helping myself.

Lee Fitzgerald is a straight shooter and tells it like it is. While this may be very hard to swallow at times, her compassion, ethical and moral fiber, dedication and commitment to the families she works with are far above and beyond the call of duty. To this day, I still received an occasional text, email or phone call from her. Just to check in, say hello and ask if all is well in our world.

It was a long battle and the hardest one my son and I have ever had to fight, but my son is now clean and working on achieving the goals he has set for himself.
